## Trial progress

PRECIOUS has started patient recruitment in all 9 countries!

The **Institute of Psychiatry and Neurology**, Warsaw (Poland) and **Ioannina University Hospital** (Greece) have recruited their first patient. **Universitätsklinikum Heidelberg** (Germany) had their Site Initiating Visit (SIV) recently and will start recruiting patients.

3. ASST di Mantova, IT and University Medical Center Hamburg Eppendorf, DE (both 6 patients)

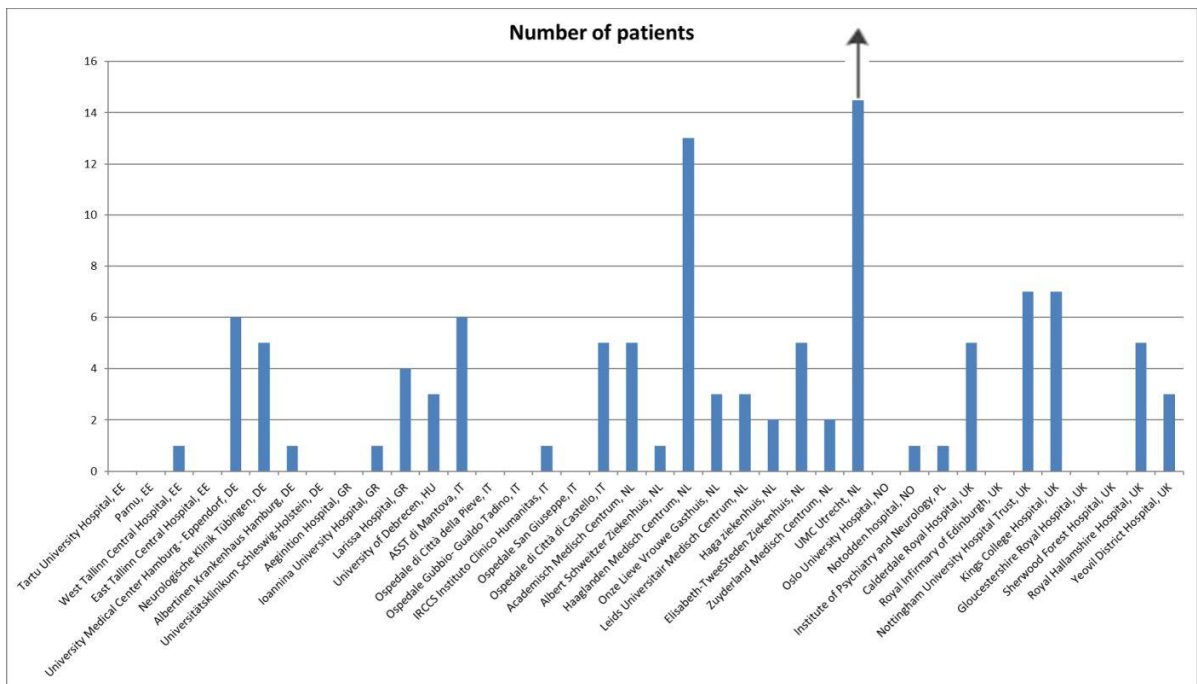
